BOARD OF TRUSTEES UPDATE

The Board of Trustees meets bi-monthly on the 4th Tuesday of the month. They recently met on May 24th when officers for the 2022-2023 year were elected. Lonnie Rufenacht was elected Chair, Tom Warner Vice Chair, Ruth Kauffman Treasurer, and Karen Walker Secretary. Bonnie Heatwole serves as an advisor to the executive committee as the Past Chair.

Carla Mitchell, Interim CEO completed her first three months and will continue in her role as the board maintains its search for a new CEO with the assistance of Mennonite Health Services.

Staffing continues to be a concern at the Care Center (as it is with all health care organizations throughout the country). Currently Fairlawn is utilizing some temporary staff in addition to our regular staff to ensure resident care.

Fairlawn Haven has received additional government funding to support increased costs that have resulted due to the pandemic and ongoing staffing shortage. This funding has been essential to keeping Fairlawn operational, as current Medicaid rates do not cover the increased cost of daily care for residents that receive this benefit.

The Board confirmed the approval to permanently decrease the size of the nursing home from 105 beds to 99 beds. Currently the Care Center is temporarily operating only 89 beds to ensure quality of care in light of the current staffing shortage..

COVID INFORMATION

- From AARP "CDC strengthens booster recommendation for older Americans. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) upgraded its guidance to older Americans and those age 12 and older who are immunocompromised from saying that these individuals "may" get a second COVID-19 vaccine booster shot to saying they "should" get a fourth dose. "Over the past month we have seen steady increases in cases, with a steep and substantial increase in hospitalizations for older Americans," says a May 19 CDC statement. "While older Americans have the highest coverage of any age group of first booster doses, most older Americans received their last dose (either their primary series or their first booster dose) many months ago, leaving many who are vulnerable without the protection they may need to prevent severe disease, hospitalization and death. Whether it is your first booster or your second, if you haven't had a vaccine dose since the beginning of December 2021 and you are eligible, now is the time to get one."
- COVID vaccine and booster shots are available through the Care Center. Contact Jake at 567.444.5102 if you would like to be scheduled to get the vaccine or booster at our next clinic.
- If you have tested positive for COVID, please contact our office 567.444.5102 so we can take proper precaution should you need assistance during your quarantine period.
- Visitors to the Care Center are required to wear a mask.



- Clogs caused by sanitary wipes that are advertised as "flushable" continue to be a problem.
- Adult and Baby Wipes <u>ARE NOT</u> flushable and can cause significant plumbing issues.
- Please do not flush the wipes. Throw them away to protect the plumbing in your home.

Fairlawn Campus Guidelines for Trees/Lawns, Ornamental/Flowerbeds/Patios Guidelines for Mowing, Trimming, Flowerbeds, Ornamental, Trees and Landscaping

Fairlawn Responsibility

1. Make the final decision on the manner and extent of all trimming, mowing, planting and landscaping of the Fairlawn Campus, all entities included.

2. Be informed of any desired changes to the landscaping and flowerbeds in any of the entities before the changes occur. A request for changes should be made utilizing the Project Request Form, available from the Fairlawn Inc. Manager or Project Manager.

3. Service companies outside of Fairlawn Maintenance Department shall not be contracted for grounds care, in any entity by a resident or lessee without prior approval from the Fairlawn Inc. Manager or Project Manager.

4. Any approved contractors will invoice Fairlawn for work completed. Fairlawn will then invoice the resident for the appropriate portion of the accrued cost.

5. In the case of ornamental bushes and trees that have been damaged by acts of nature, Fairlawn shall remove the damaged bush or tree. Fairlawn will provide replacement bushes or trees. Fairlawn will reimburse up to \$30 per bush or tree. All of this will be completed as determined by the Fairlawn Inc. Manager, Project Manager or Maintenance Supervisor.

6. Determine what trees need to be removed, added, pruned, relocated and planted in all entities. Fairlawn shall coordinate and perform all tree care.

7. Maintain flowerbeds around the living unit of a resident or lessee when the resident or lessee is unable to do so. The flowerbeds will be cleared and mulch or stone put around shrubs.

Resident Responsibility

1. Request permission to perform any desired changes to landscaping and flowerbeds in any of the entities before the changes occur. Refer to #2 in Fairlawn Responsibility.

2. Pay for approved changes to existing flowerbeds and landscaping. Refer to #4 Fairlawn Responsibility.

3. Maintain flowerbeds and landscaping which the resident(s) plant(s).

4. Refrain from fertilizing, watering or mowing lawns. All lawn care will be provided by Fairlawn

5. May be permitted to water plants in flowerbed and landscaping in a reasonable manner. A surcharge may be charged in the event of excessive water usage.

6. May be permitted to maintain a flag pole and/or landscape decorations within the flowerbed. Resident will maintain and be responsible for repairs/damage due to but not limited to acts of nature.

7. Report needed repairs or concerns to the Fairlawn Inc. Manager, Project Manager or Maintenance Supervisor.
