

A Message from Maintenance

Over the past few months, we have seen an increase in the use of humidifiers. Humidifiers are permitted to be used; however, we ask you to use distilled water. Using tap water causes a mineral build-up and scale on

windows, inside the furnace & ducts, and clogs furnace filters causing overheating. Thank you for your cooperation.



REMINDER: DO NOT DRIVE IN THE YARD. This time of the year brings soggy soil and turf. Parking, or driving in the yard is discouraged and creates extra cost and unnecessary work.
