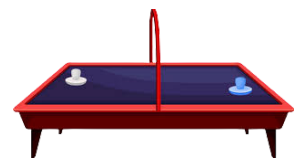

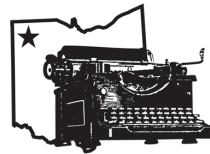

## WIPES CLOG PIPES!

Hey neighbors! We have a quick reminder to help keep Fairlawn's sewer system running smoothly. Please do not flush wipes down the toilet—even those labeled as "flushable". They all cause the same damage.

Unlike toilet paper, these wipes do not break down in water. Instead, they:

- Clog pipes in your home and the city's main lines.
- Damage expensive equipment at our wastewater treatment plants.
- Combine with grease to create massive "fatbergs" that cause messy sewer backups.

The Golden Rule: Only flush the 3 P's—Pee, Poo, and (toilet) Paper.

 Everything else, including baby wipes & cleaning wipes, belongs in the trash.

Help us prevent costly repairs and protect our environment by trashing the  
wipes!

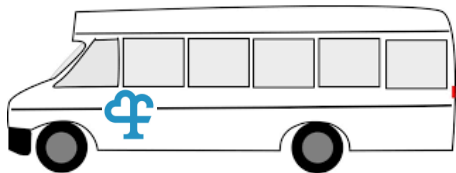

# ARS Introduces New 35-Gallon Recycling Cart Option

Archbold Refuse Service (ARS), in partnership with the Village of Archbold, has announced updates to its residential recycling program, including the addition of a new 35-gallon recycling cart option.

The new size is designed to give residents greater flexibility and ensure every household has a recycling solution that fits their needs. Previously, residents could only enroll in a 65-gallon recycling cart service.

With the program update, households may now choose between:

**65-Gallon Cart** - Ideal for most families and high-volume recyclers OR a **35-Gallon Cart** - A smaller, more compact option suited for lower-volume recyclers or homes with limited storage space.

The new 35-gallon cart offers a practical alternative for residents who may not need the larger capacity.

## What Current Customers Need to Know

Residents who have already signed up for the 65-gallon cart and do not wish to make any changes do not need to take further action. Their current order will remain in place.

Those who have signed up for the 65-gallon cart but prefer to switch to the new 35-gallon option must contact ARS or resubmit the service form.

Residents who have not yet selected a recycling cart are encouraged to do so.

## Registration Deadline and Methods

All residents must register their cart choice by **March 31, 2026**.

Registration can be completed in one of two ways:

- **By Phone:** Call 419-783-1971 and provide your name, address, phone number, and preferred cart size (35-gallon or 65-gallon).
- **By Mail:** Complete and return the service form to: Archbold Refuse Service, 200 Taylor Parkway, Archbold, OH 43502

## Delivery Timeline and Bin Collection

New recycling carts are tentatively scheduled for delivery in late May 2026. Once the new carts are distributed, the existing yellow 18-gallon recycling bins will be collected and will no longer be serviced. Residents are encouraged to review their recycling needs and submit their selection before the deadline to ensure uninterrupted service.

To continue providing the highest level of service for everyone, we ask residents and families to help us maintain healthy and respectful boundaries.

### **Respecting Staff Privacy:**

Our employees are dedicated to their roles at Fairlawn, and they deserve personal time and privacy just like anyone else. While friendly relationships are a valued part of community living, maintaining professional boundaries is important.

### **Please keep the following in mind:**

- Staff members should not receive personal calls or texts on their private cell phones.
- Employees should not be contacted outside of work hours unless they have instructed you to do so.
- Visiting an employee's private residence is never appropriate.
- Family members are also expected to follow these guidelines.

Even with good intentions, contacting staff through personal channels can create discomfort and interfere with their time off.

### **Use Courtesy and Good Judgment**

Before reaching out to a staff member directly, please ask yourself:

- Can this wait until business hours?
- Is there an official number I should call instead?
- Would I be comfortable being contacted at home for this reason?

Both of these numbers are call only, THEY CANNOT EXCEPT TEXT MESSAGES

These lines are monitored to ensure requests are properly logged and directed to the appropriate team member. Using official channels helps us:

- Track and prioritize requests
- Respond promptly
- Protect staff privacy
- Maintain fairness for all residents

Following these procedures allows emergencies to be addressed faster, ensures non-emergency requests are documented properly, and supports staff in maintaining a healthy work-life balance – while providing consistent and equitable service to all.

Our goal is to serve every resident with professionalism and care – and that begins with clear communication and mutual respect.
